All Saints Garden Art&Craft Market invites friends old and new to join us for our 30th Birthday celebration on 2nd July. A Jazz Band will be on hand to provide music, and our coffee van will be serving free coffees to morning visitors (between 10am and 1pm). The Market was started in the 1975, as a way of supporting Cambridge artists and craftspeople by giving them somewhere to sell what they make. It was the brainchild of the City Council's legendary Ken Woollard, who also founded the Cambridge Folk Festival.

These include fused and stained glass, jewellery, painting, pottery, wood-turning, photography and much else besides.
